Green Star Award

The Green Star Award was initiated in 2019 to recognize congregations that completed at least three significant environmental activities in the prior year. In so

doing, they fostered awareness of our spiritual oneness with the Earth and promoted active care of creation. Since its inception, the number of awardees has increased nearly every year and is now one of EarthCare's most popular programs. Sixty four (64) awards have been given, sometimes multiple times to the same congregation. Congratulations to all of you!

USABC has completed all seven steps of the Path to EarthCare and achieved Level C of the Program! Here is a summary:

1. **Pray**--Prayer creates a consciousness for inspiration, guidance and community. Prayer will guide your ministry to express its unique vision of caring for the earth and creation. **Ongoing**
2. **Vision**--defines the purpose, critical processes and goals of the **EarthCare Program**. **We have developed a vision statement.**
3. **Inspire**--We have maintained a sacred space for creation through Sunday services and special ceremonies. **5 activities**
4. **Educate**--We have sponsored educational activities within the church and within the community. **6 activities**
5. **Act**-- Right action will follow based upon the needs and vision of the community to care for the earth and creation.

Actions:


Conducted an internal Environmental/Energy Audit in September 2023.

1. Energy/Water Conservation.
2. Recycling.
3. Waste Minimization. Be a mindful consumer of goods purchased, or of food wasted.
4. Conservancy of Natural Resources.

6. Mindful Eating.

6. **Share**--We have shared our ideas and successes within the congregation and the community. **11 activities**
7. **Reaffirm**-- We have periodically renewed and re-assessed our vision. **1 activity**

A Final Note

Now, as we close the book on the original EarthCare program, let's take a look back.

Unity's EarthCare program rose up from the grassroots of the Unity movement. It came from the deep desire to express Unity's belief in our oneness with all life in ways that directly impact our planet.

The foundation for EarthCare was laid in 2001, when Unity minister Kathy Harwood Long represented Unity at "Sacred Encounters," an Interfaith

conference on the environment in the Pacific Northwest. In 2002, the Northwest (NW) Region an EarthCare agenda was adopted, and in 2003 began developing ideas for the program, which included a seven-step “Path to EarthCare” model. The Great Lakes Unity Regional Churches (GLURC) was also interested in EarthCare. In 2007, Rev. Kathy Harwood Long and Rev. Jane Simmons spearheaded the creation of the Unity Church’s International EarthCare Team under the Unity Spiritual Action ministry team.

In January of 2008, Kym Farmer, Ron Habin and Mike McCord met at the Mid-Year Meetings at Unity Village. From this meeting, the logo of EarthCare was determined along with its organizational framework and goals. EarthCare was also made part of the Thriving in Unity 1.0 program as a benchmark and component. Soon thereafter, a Core Team was established that created its vision and mission statements, wrote the EarthCare Program, and began administering the team activities.

In 2010, the program’s name was changed to the Unity EarthCare Team (UET), and in 2012 it became a separate ministry team.

Since the program’s inception, EarthCare has been UWM’s voice for climate action, which expanded over the years to include programs such as Mindful Eating and Ecological Social Justice. And through it all, Unity Worldwide Ministries has supported its vision and mission every step of the way.

Here are some of the major actions taken by UWM and UWH through the years, at EarthCare’s recommendation:

Joint Climate Change Resolution by UWM/UWH, 2015:

As humanity has been primarily responsible for climate change, we affirm that it will be humanity which will co-create a vision of the environmentally conscious use of energy and our planet’s fragile resources. We joyfully participate in our God-given role as good stewards of the Earth. Through prayer, meditation, church or spiritual center-inspired activism, and the skillful use of media, we affirm that the Unity movement is a world leader in advancing the growth of environmental consciousness and right action

Covenant adopted by the UWM Board of Trustees, January 2019:

The earth does not belong to man—man belongs to the earth. All things are connected like the blood that unites us all. Man did not weave the web of life; he is merely a strand in it. Whatever he does to the web, he does to himself.—attributed to Chief Seattle The Unity first principle states that there is only one presence and one power pervading the entire Universe. Unity Worldwide Ministries is committed to embodying this principle and honoring our Oneness with the earth. Recognizing that we live in a web of interconnectedness, and our actions affect the whole, we endeavor to touch the earth lightly and with reverence. And we encourage our members to do the same

Climate Change Reaffirmation adopted by UWM Board of Trustees, 2019

UWM acknowledges that climate change is real and that human activity is a significant cause of climate change. We hereby affirm our power to restore balance to the planet and all life forms and engage this power through our conscious and compassionate choices.

Corporate DEI Resolution adopted by UWM Board of Trustees, 2021

Unity Worldwide Ministries stands for anti-racism, i.e., we are opposed to racial hatred, racial violence, bias, systemic racism, and the oppression of people of color. We stand for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion for people who are marginalized because of color. No individual or group should be made to live in fear or excluded from society. Recent events in the United States and the world remind us that violent repression, prejudices, injustices, and inequalities towards people of color are embedded in societies, from social structures to institutions to cultures. Unity chooses to be more aware and take positive action in dismantling systemic racism and the social structures that support injustice and prejudice, and we raise awareness throughout our membership, churches, and centers.

We would like to give a special thanks to Kym Farmer for leading the team in its early years, followed by Ron Habin who gave many years of dedicated, steady and forward-looking leadership. I led the team from 2018 and am looking forward to my new role as Secretary of **Unity EarthCare Alliance**.

And so we begin the next phase of our journey, one that will as Spiritual Leader Kathy Harwood Long writes, *expand the reach of our work for consciousness and action on behalf of the earth.*

There is so much to do! We are in challenging times, both in reality and politically, and the threat to the environment is as great or greater than ever before. That's why we all must work together to make Unity a powerful force and global leader in addressing the climate change crisis, and move society towards being a more just world that works for all.
